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HOW TO USE THIS GUIDE

he purpose of this Guide is to provide a general overview of our GLOBALSELECT programme and the benefits it offers talented international students as a unique entry route to a full degree programme at Amerian I n s t i t u t e of Commonwealth.

It is therefore important that you read this Guide in conjunction with the more detailed information on our website before deciding whether GLOBALSELECT could be the right choice for you.

If, however, you're reading this guide as a print-out, the easiest way to find us when you're next in front of a computer is to key in www.aic-uni.org then search for GLOBALSELECT. This will take you to our Home Page and you can then follow the links to other pages from there.





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What is GLOBALSELECT?

The **AIC University** has a long tradition of welcoming international students and helping them achieve their full potential, both academically and personally as individuals.

Regardless of country of origin, we select only the brightest and best students who we think will gain from all the best the University has to offer. We set high standards for admission to our Degree programmes. But, we have come to realise that this resulted in the exclusion of highly talented students from certain countries whose secondary school certificate is equivalent to Ordinary (O) Level.

This is why we have introduced GLOBALSELECT as a way of offering these exceptional students the opportunity to join our undergraduate degree programmes without the need to gain further qualifications on a pre-university foundation course first.

GLOBALSELECT students will therefore enjoy the same status and advantages of their fellow direct entry classmates with full integration into all aspects of the core study programme from day one. The only difference is that GLOBALSELECT students will receive additional semesters (summer) during their study year. This will help meeting up with the required standards for Bachelor Degree and to fill any knowledge gaps identified by the skills assessment exercise, which will be taken prior to being accepted for graduation.

In the following pages, we'll tell you more about how the GLOBALSELECT programme works and what makes it unique as a pathway to a degree that will be recognised as a mark of excellence and achievement all over the world.





The American Institute of Commonwealth is an accredited higher education institution in Togo (Africa) established to offer Undergraduate and Postgraduate programs to both francophones and anglophones students at an international standard.

We offer two entry routes to degree programmes for international students – GLOBALSELECT and GLOBALDIRECT. GLOBALDIRECT is for international students whose qualifications from their home countries are recognised by the University as being equivalent to **A-levels**.

The GLOBALDIRECT route would also be available to students from francophone countries whose national qualifications are recognised by the University –Irrespective of which country you have taken your exams in, if you have studied for A (Advanced)-levels, the French Baccalaureate (BAC), you would be eligible for the GLOBALDIRECT route.

Outstanding applicants with national qualifications (O Level- with 5 credits; Maths and English) from commonwealth countries, would be considered for entry via the GLOBALSELECT route. If your country is not in commonwealth (check the map), and you are unsure which route is suitable for you, please email the Admissions Office for further advice – admissions@aic-uni.org

Remember – if you come from any of these countries but have also studied for A-levels, HND or NCE, you should apply to the University through the GLOBAL**DIRECT** route instead.

Very Important – Whatever your country of origin, you will also need to demonstrate that you already possess sufficient English skills for your application to be considered. The requirements for GLOBALSELECT for non English speaking students are TOEFL (IBT) with an overall score of 90 and a minimum of 20 in listening, writing, reading and speaking.

Your GLOBALSELECT pathway... step-by-step

Step 1

Qualifications

Gain school leaving qualifications in your own country. (NECO, WAEC...etc)

Step 2

Apply

Apply through <u>www.aic-uni.org</u> selecting the relevant course for **Global Select** students.

Step 3

Notification

If your first stage application is successful, you will be notified through your mail.

Step 4

Acceptance

You will be required to make the necessary payment (**Application, Registration 60% Tuition Fees**), in order to receive a formal offer to join the University as a Global Select first Year student.

Step 5

Begin your Journey

You can start your journey down to the University in Lome, Republic of Togo (Africa).

You are advised to inform the Student Affairs department by filling the online form on $\underline{www.aic-uni.edu}$.

This helps in guiding you to your right destination.





WHAT QUALIFICATIONS WILL YOU NEED?

The GLOBALSELECT is a programme dedicated to any applicant with a secondary school leaving certificate equialent to an O (Ordinary) Level such as WAEC, NECO, GCE. Such applicant must have minimum of 5 Credits in English, Maths and any other 3 relevants subjects.

The GLOBAL**DIRECT** programme is dedicated to any applicant with a previous qualification equivalent to an **A** (**Advanced**) **level** such as **NABTEB**, **ND**, **HND**, **NCE**. For francophones, the **Bacalaureat** (**BAC**) or its equivalent is required for direct entry.

Follow the guidelines in the APPLY section on the website www.aic-uni.org making the right pathway choice. Apply through www.aic-uni.org selecting the relevant course for Global Select students. You will need to upload your credentials (O level Result, Birth Certificate and your International Passport) and indicate your resumption period. You're A level result will be also required for upload.



HOW TO APPLY

As a prospective GLOBALSELECT student, you will need to apply for entry in exactly the same way as any GLOBALDIRECT candidate.

You can apply through online at www.aic-uni.org or contact the Office of International Students on whatsApp +228 79 89 35 59 / +234 909 762 5794. If you are applying through an agent in your own country, it is important to seek their advice on the best way to complete and forward your application. If you do not have an agent, you can get helpful advice and guidance from Admission & Recruitment at Admissions@aic-uni.org.

To give your application maximum impact, please follow all the guidelines on the website closely and make full use of the many useful links to help and advice you'll find on our website. From there, you'll also be able to access the main University website where you can order or download our Prospectus for undergraduate entry.

We welcome applications from international students from September onwards of each year, with a preferred deadline of June 30th. In certain circumstances this deadline may be extended.



PRE-ENTRY ASSESSMENT FOR A SCHOLARSHIP-STEP-BY-STEP

If you are asked to undertake our two-part assessment exercise, it shows that we were impressed by your application and are seriously considering offering you a scholarship on a degree programme as a GLOBALSELECT student.

The purpose of this assessment exercise is to help us gain a better understanding of your capabilities in your preferred study area, and your level of competency in English. It will enable us to ensure that you have access to support needed to address any shortfalls and get you up to speed with your fellow students.

This level of personal support is what makes GLOBALSELECT the ideal choice for outstanding international applicants, who wish to complete a three year degree programme at the AIC University. You should therefore think of pre-entry assessment in terms of the personal benefits it will ultimately offer you rather than as a test for you to pass or fail. However we will be expecting the results of your assessment to confirm the potential we saw in you from the information you provided about yourself in your application.

There are two parts to the assessment process. The first stage is a short online exercise that you can complete at home or from anywhere else where you have access to the internet, answering questions which have been carefully chosen for their relevance to your particular area of study.

The Second Stage

If we then make you an offer of entry and you accept it, you will need to undertake a second assessment of similar length on arrival on campus. This will not only validate the results of your first assessment, but highlight any weaknesses in specific aspects of your chosen study area that you may need extra help with during your first year.





WHAT CAN YOU EXPECT IN YOUR FIRST YEAR?

Shortly after you arrive at the University to take up your place on a degree programme, a meeting will be arranged with the **Offices of the Course**Coordinator and Student Affairs— who will monitor your first year progress and always be there for you to discuss any problems that might be affecting your studies.

As a GLOBALSELECT student, your initial meeting with the Office of the Course Coordinator will focus on designing a personal study plan which will include a schedule of supplementary courses to address any knowledge gaps in your core study area. The non-english speaking students joining the University will be required to attend English for Academic Purpose course. These are specially designed to help students attain the speaking, reading and writing standards they'll need to gain full benefit from their studies, and will count towards the number of credits required to successfully move into second year.

The Course Coordinator will help you decide what combination of course options in each semester might be the most suitable and beneficial choice for you.

Apart from the supplementary courses designed specifically for GLOBALSELECT students during summer, you will attend the same lectures and undertake the same practical assignments in your core subject as every other first year student on your particular degree programme. In other words, regardless of your entry route, you'll be treated in exactly the same way and enjoy all the same privileges and benefits right from day one!

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YEAR TWO



You will need to accumulate **60** credit points from a combination of your core subjects and other complementary courses to successfully complete your first year studies and move on to year two.

With help and advice from the Course Coordinator, this is the point where you will need to decide on which specialist subjects within your core discipline you wish to study over the three remaining years of your degree programme. There is the option in many of the subjects to extend your study for a further year to attain an integrated masters degree.







WHAT SUPPORT CAN YOU EXPECT AS AN INTERNATIONAL STUDENT?

By choosing the University of AIC you will have the advantage of being allocated a Personal Tutor who you can turn to for help and advice throughout your study years. Your Personal Tutor will always be there to help you make the right decisions on course selection, to discuss your progress through regular meetings and to offer guidance on any issues that might be affecting your studies or personal wellbeing.

In addition to your Personal Tutor, you can also count on the support of our International Office team. As over 30% of the University's annual student intake is made up of students from outside Togo, we understand just how important it is to have a dedicated International Office to help each and every overseas student settle into University life and get the most out of the time they spend with us here.

Through the International Office, you can access a huge range of support services from pre-entry and onwards throughout your university career. These can include airport welcoming and familiarisation activities, help with any immigration problems such as visa extensions, social and information events and, if necessary, liaison on your behalf with our Accommodation Services team.

You'll find the support offered by our International Office to be invaluable from the moment you receive your confirmed offer of entry to AIC University.

You can also look forward to constant support from the university's award winning student organisation – set up by the University Students' Association to promote internationalisation and enhance the living and learning experience of our international students with a full calendar of exciting social events and engagement programmes.



WHERE WILL YOU LIVE?



As an international student, you can apply for accommodation at our main Hostels Complex or other equally convenient university student housing sites to help you feel right at home during your all-important first year. However, your accommodation can only be guaranteed if you apply for the type of accommodation you would prefer by our deadline of **August 16 and January 15** in the year of your proposed entry to the university.

Assuming you are coming to the university as a single student, we can offer two types of guaranteed accommodation – **fully-catered** or **self-catering** in a shared house or flat with other first year students

Fully-catered

This will usually be in our Hostels complex. Your monthly rent will include breakfast and dinner Monday to Friday with brunch and dinner at weekends, internet connections in each study bedroom and telephones in most, a regular cleaning service, contents insurance, secure bike storage and all heating, hot water and electricity costs.

Self-catering

You may choose this as the cheaper rental option, but you should remember that you will have to buy all your own food which can add considerably to your monthly budget



WHAT ABOUT EVERYDAY EXPENSES?

The cost of living in Togo is generally lower than many other countries in Africa, but it may seem a lot higher than in your own country. As you must be able to demonstrate that you have sufficient funds to cover living expenses as well as tuition fees, the figures below will hopefully give you a better idea of how much it could cost you in outgoings during your first year as an AIC University student.

The table below should only be taken as a guide to your **minimum** weekly living expenses in either fully-catered or self-catering university accommodation.

Fully-catered room	Self-catering room	
Rent	\$1.000/Sem.	\$300/Sem.
Food	\$400/Sem.	\$700-\$1.000/Sem
Mobile phone	\$100-\$150	\$200-\$250

On top of this you will need to consider fixed expenses, including the \$100 deposit on your accommodation which all students have to pay before they arrive. There is also the estimated minimum cost of \$50 a year for textbooks, photocopying and stationery, and the current \$10 fee to register with the local police on arrival if required.

You will also need to think about other routine costs such as clothing, travel, going to the cinema or just generally socialising with your fellow students
